it s hard to conceive of a topic of more broad and personal interest than the study of the mind in addition to its traditional investigation by the disciplines of psychology psychiatry and neuroscience the mind has also been a focus of study in the fields of philosophy economics anthropology linguistics computer science molecular biology education and literature in all these approaches there is an almost universal fascination with how the mind works and how it affects our lives and our behavior studies of the mind and brain have crossed many exciting thresholds in recent years and the study of mind now represents a thoroughly cross disciplinary effort researchers from a wide range of disciplines seek answers to such questions as what is mind how does it operate what is consciousness this encyclopedia brings together scholars from the entire range of mind related academic disciplines from across the arts and humanities social sciences life sciences and computer science and engineering to explore the multidimensional nature of the human mind

this volume has as its primary aim the examination of issues concerning executive function and frontal lobe development while many texts have addressed these issues this is the first to do so within a specifically developmental framework this area of cognitive function has received increasing attention over the past decade and it is now established that the frontal lobes and associated executive functions are critical for efficient functioning in daily life it is also clear and of particular relevance to this text that these functions develop gradually through childhood and then deteriorate during old age these developmental trajectories and the impact of any interruption to them are the focus of this volume

an influential body of recent work on moral psychology has stressed the interconnections among ethics narrative and empathy yet as patrick colm hogan argues this work is so vague in its use of the term narrative as to be almost substanceless and this vagueness is in large part due to the neglect of literary study extending his previous work on universal story structures hogan argues that we can transform ill defined intuitions about narrative and ethics into explicit and systematic accounts of the deep connections between moral attitudes and narratives these connections are in turn inseparable from empathy a concept that hogan proceeds to clarify and defend against a number of widely read critiques in the course of the book hogan develops and illustrates his arguments through analyses of global narratives constructing illuminating ethical interpretations of literary works ranging from shakespeare to chinese drama and the bhagavad gita

as the primary function to mobilize the organism to deal quickly with important interpersonal encounters applied to a social setting the key function of emotions is to solve problems which are important for social relationships thus emotions play have a functional role in guiding individuals in human interactions however emotions can also lead a person to irrational action and are even almost guaranteed to be wrong sometimes

this book seeks to reframe the normative narrative of the culpable person in american criminal law through a more humanising lens it embraces such a reframed narrative to revise the criteria of the current voluntarist architecture of culpability and to advance a paradigm of punishment that positions social rehabilitation as its core principle the book constructs this narrative by considering behavioural and neuroscientific insights into the functions of emotions and socio environmental factors within moral behaviour in social settings hence it suggests culpability notions that reflect a more contextualised view of human conduct and argues that such revised notions are better suited to the principle of personal guilt furthermore it suggests a model of punishment that values the dynamic power of change of individuals and acknowledges the importance of social relationships and positive environments to foster patterns of social re integration ultimately this book argues that the potential adoption of the proposed models of culpability and punishment which view people through a more comprehensive lens may be a key factor for turning criminal justice into a less punitive more inclusionary and non stigmatising system

the author uses the treatment of moral dilemmas as the basis for an alternative view of the structure of ethics and its relation to human psychology in its treatment of the role of emotion in ethics the argument of the book outlines a new way of packing motivational force into moral meaning that allows for a socially based version of moral realism
