first published in 2007 this book examines the designs of seventeen architecture and design schools and answers questions such as how has architectural education evolved and what is its future are architectural schools discernible types of designs and what are their effects on those who experience them what lessons can be learned from evaluations of recently completed school buildings and what guidance do they provide for the design of future ones included in the multiple approaches to evaluation are examinations of the history of architectural education and building form typologies of school for architecture and the systematic user evaluations of the aesthetics function and technology which reveal the strengths to encourage and weaknesses to avoid in future designs while offering specific guidelines for schools of design it also includes findings that extend beyond the walls of design schools and can be applied to everything from the interiors of educational and campus buildings to planning offices and gathering places to build communities this book will make readers more aware of problems in architectural interiors and suggest ways to make interiors work better for the building occupants

architecture design notebook focuses on the process of design as pragmatic and non theoretical dealing systematically with the core design curriculum it clearly demonstrates the skills required for designing at undergraduate level providing students with fundamental maxims of design and a framework within which they can approach their work this book supports undergraduates as they learn to produce solutions to design challenges this vital design companion underpins the cornerstone of an architectural undergraduates studies studio design projects with over 100 sketches included the book inspires student s design ideas this updated edition includes new sections on green architecture urban space typology and the virtual building a peter fawcett is an architect and critic who combines teaching with sporadic practice he is currently professor emeritus of architecture at the university of nottingham and visiting professor at the university of lincoln in recent years his work has been placed in architectural competitions and has been hung at the royal academy and royal ulster academy

from the earliest periods of architecture and building architects actions have been conditioned by rules regulations standards and governance practices these range from socio cultural and religious codes seeking to influence the formal structure of settlement patterns to prescriptive building regulations specifying detailed elements of design in relation to the safety of building structures in architectural design and regulation the authors argue that the rule and regulatory basis of architecture is part of a broader field of socio institutional and political interventions in the design and development process that serve to delimit and define the scope of the activities of architects the book explores how the practices of architects are embedded in complex systems of rules and regulations the authors develop the understanding that the rules and regulations of building form and performance ought not to be counterpoised as external to creative processes and practices but as integral to the creation of well designed places the contribution of architectural design and regulation is to show that far from the rule and regulatory basis of architecture undermining the capacities of architects to design they are the basis for new and challenging activities that open up possibilities for reinventing the actions of architects

the construction of buildings is learnt through experience and the inheritance of a tradition in forming buildings over several thousand years successful construction learns from this experience which becomes embodied in principles of application though materials and techniques change various elements have to perform the same function principles of element design identifies all the relevant elements and then breaks these elements down into all their basic constituents making it possible for students to fully understand the given theory and principles behind each part as all building projects are subject to guidance through the building regulations and british standards this book gives an immediate reference back to relevant information to help practitioners and contractors identify key documents needed yvonne dean b a hons b a open riba an architect energy consultant and materials technologist she also has 15 years experience as a lecturer travels widely and is a guest lecturer at many universities she pioneered an access course for women into architecture and building which has been used as a template by others and has been instrumental in helping to change the teaching of technology for architects and designers peter rich aa dipl hons architect started his career with 14 years experience as a qualified architectural technician he then joined the aa school of architecture working with bill allen and john bickerdike after his graduation later becoming a partner of bickerdike allen rich and partners he also taught building construction at the bartlett school of architecture university college london and architectural design at the polytechnic of north london he now acts as a consultant

the mentality that consumerism and economic growth are cure alls is one of the biggest obstacles to real sustainability but any change seems impossible unthinkable our contemporary paradox finds us relying for our well being on consumer driven economic growth that we actually can t afford not in environmental economic or social terms although architecture and design have long been seen as engines for consumerism and growth increasing numbers of designers are concerned about the problems resulting from growth but designers face a paradox of their own in scenarios of sustainable consumption where people consume or build significantly less what will be left for designers to do this book informed by recent research into the viability of a steady state economy sets an agenda for addressing the designer s paradox of sustainable consumption the agenda includes ways that architecture and design can help transition us towards a new kind of economy that prioritizes real wellbeing rather than economic growth packed with examples and illustrations the book argues that taking action or activism is an important but so far underexplored way for architects and designers to confront consumerism the first chapters explore how economic growth and consumerism shape and are shaped by the professions of architecture product and landscape design and how we can understand the problem of consumerism as four main challenges that designers are already addressing the book maps out the main issues surrounding the development of metrics that designers and others can use to measure wellbeing instead of simply measuring economic growth the second half of the book looks at how design activism works and its connection to growth and consumerist issues these chapters examine how activist practices are financed highlight five specific methods that designers use in working for social change and investigate the power of these methods the book concludes with a consideration of what design s role might be in a post growth society

in the past few years the image of tender procedures in which dutch public clients selected an architect has been dominated by distressing newspaper headlines architects fear that the current tender culture will harm the quality of our built environment due to a potential lack of diversity creativity and innovation in architectural design clients often allow legal requirements to overrule their actual wishes the current practice of architect selection by european public clients has its roots in three distinct systems 1 tendering for services and works 2 the selective search to identify a suitable architect or design team and 3 the architectural competition it is these diverse roots of the selection process that appear to cause conflicts between the legal rationality of procurement and the psychological rationality of public decision making this phd research addresses the origin of these problems as currently experienced by public commissioning clients in architect selection and proposes pragmatic implications for future practice it is therefore of interest for commissioning clients management consultants policy makers and legal advisors but also for designers and researchers in the field of architecture and decision making based on four empirical cases the author shows that during architect selection the rational legal requirements clash with the psychological process of decision making decision makers only start to make sense of the proposed designs once they are confronted with the alternatives it is therefore almost impossible for clients to design a selection procedure and announce the criteria and weighing factors up front as required by procurement law the scientific underpinning of the findings is found in four theoretical perspectives on value judgements in design and the latest decision theories in which emotion intuition and expertise play prominent roles in the conclusions five sensemaking processes are distinguished and several underlying situational characteristics are identified that influence the selection process such as complexity uncertainty and decision support the thesis proposes fifteen factors for a successful design of a tender procedure to select an architect it also offers recommendations for change of the current dutch practice

developing your design process is your primary source for acquiring knowledge of how and why you design it will help you understand how architects think as well as learn why you should educate yourself about design culture you ll explore the spark of imagination that leads to a strong concept realize the importance of sketching and rough drafts focus your original concept to make your abstract idea visible and finally step away for a moment to critically question your concept by identifying its strengths and weaknesses you ll also be introduced to the language of design architectural terminology historic precedents and designers in addition to the why what and how of the design process the book is illustrated throughout with international examples of work by professionals and students in the discipline of architecture and other related design professions
